Admissions Policy: - Middle Years

Policy Guidelines

- Eligibility Criteria for admission to JISK MIDDLE SCHOOL 1(Grade 6)
The placement of students will be determined by their school records reflecting their ability to pursue the IB Middle Years program. Previous school records may affect subjects' options in arts, design, and language. We strive to be inclusive in the Middle Years Program however, students must be able to access the Middle Years Program curriculum. In addition to focusing on academic subjects, we expect students to actively develop their approaches to learning skills throughout their study.
- Admission criteria for JISK MIDDLE SCHOOL Years 2 and 3 (Grades 7 and 8) and JISK MIDDLE SCHOOL Years 4 and 5 (Grades 9 and 10)

Admissions and Readiness examinations for grades 7–10 will be interactive. These readiness assessments are a tool both the school and the parents may use to determine where the child stands and whether any specific areas of weakness need to be addressed. Please keep in mind that admissions for grades 7–10 will be verified only after the readiness examinations and assessment tests (for grade 10, a candidate must enroll in the program for a minimum of one year to be eligible for the JISK MIDDLE SCHOOL Certificate) (JISK MIDDLE SCHOOL year 5). So, a candidate will only be accepted if he or she meets all the above requirements.

- Please remember that the admission process for a special-needs candidate is unique and may take longer. When applying for admission, a student with a particular need (dyslexia, autism, lack of interest in writing, slow learner, etc.) should be communicated when taking admission. Admission will be canceled unless adequate communication is maintained.
- The school will provide Language support for students coming from the PYP. For other subjects, the parents can appoint a support teacher to tutor their child in different subjects. The School will work together with the School support teacher.
